Promoting Learning, Access and Enjoyment for all our Buildings and their Settings

The Landmark Trust uses its buildings and sites, and the knowledge and crafts they generate, to enhance understanding and enjoyment of history and architecture. By these means, we hope to inspire and involve as many people as possible and so to increase and reinforce awareness of the continuing value of such sites today.

The Landmark Trust is committed to providing access to and information about our buildings and their settings to people of all ages, from all walks of life and from all parts of society. We do this by:

- Providing access to our buildings 365 days a year for holidays, with over 40,000 staying in Landmarks each year.
- Holding regular, free Open Days for day visitors across the country.
- Providing free, unrestricted access to Lundy.
- Sharing our research in a site's history, primarily through the history albums and Open Day leaflets for both adults and children, but also through talks, lectures and media participation.
- Offering whenever possible access by appointment on changeover days to our buildings.
- Being flexible and responsive in our provision of learning, access and involvement according to the conservation needs and character of individual buildings, and according to our audience.
- Working with schools and other local groups to involve them in saving, learning about and enjoying our historic sites.
- Promoting the understanding of good conservation practice.
- Facilitating training in traditional craft skills wherever possible.
- Working in partnership where appropriate the better to meet these aims.
